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TIPS FOR ERROR-FREE FPDS REPORTING—PSC

roduct Service Code (PSC)

Congress and other government agencies use the Federal Procurement Data System (FPDS) data to monitor NIH contracting spending/achievements throughout the year.

FAR 4.604(b)(1) states that the responsibility for completion and the accuracy of the individual contract action report resides with the contracting officer who awarded the contract actions.

FPDS Data Dictionary Definition - Products/Service Code

The code that best identifies the product or service procured. Codes are defined in the Product and Service Codes Manual.


Pick the code that best identifies the product or service procured. If more than one (1) code applies, then report the code that represents most of the ultimate contract value.

An incorrect entry will trigger FedDataCheck (FDC) #19, #64, or #154 –

In addition, the following FDC Alerts (#60, #96, #97, #98, #123, and #141) are triggered for other FPDS field values if the PSC is exempt or does not apply.



All contract awards must include an entry for the Product/Service Code – FDC #19.



TIPS FOR ERROR-FREE FPDS REPORTING—PSC

To improve data in FPDS and eliminate the FDC Alert, follow the tips below before routing the document for approval.

If the preponderance of the buy is for **Products**, then...

⇒ **PRISM In-Progress** – PSC (Products)

- 8A Primary/Product Service Code must reflect a code that begins with a number and not a letter FDC #64.
- 6T-Inherently Governmental Functions must be blank. FPDS Select One equate to a blank value FDC #141.
- 6F-Performance Based Service Acq, select Not applicable FDC #60.

⇒ **FPDS Draft** – PSC (Products)

- Enter the Vendor's Zip Code or Postal Code, whichever applicable in the Place of Performance Zip Code (+4) field FDC #123.
 - Place of Manufacture field must display a response appropriate for products, for example, Mfg. in the U.S.
- Products are exempt from Labor Standards, Materials, Supplies, Articles, Equipment, and Construction Wage Rate Requirements FDC #96, #97, #98.

If the preponderance of the buy is for Services, then...


⇒ PRISM In-Progress – PSC (Services)

- 6T-Inherently Governmental Functions select the appropriate response, the field cannot be blank.
- 6F-Performance Based Service Acq, select the appropriate response, the field cannot be Not applicable.
- Do Not Select PSC R497 SUPPORT- PROFESSIONAL: PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACTS FDC #154.

⇒ FPDS Draft – PSC (Services)

- Enter the Zip Code or Postal Code, whichever applicable in the Place of Performance Zip Code (+4) field where the Services are being performed FDC #151.
 - ♦ Place of Manufacture field must display a response appropriate for services.
- Select the appropriate response for Labor Standards, Materials, Supplies, Articles, Equipment, and Construction Wage Rate Requirements.

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TIPS FOR ERROR-FREE FPDS REPORTING—PSC

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Although the System for Award Management (SAM) is the official source for vendor information. Use the CRA to help you find the Vendor's PSC.

Open Outlook, address an email to <u>vendorreport@feddatacheck.net</u>, in the subject line enter the Vendor's Unique Entity ID, click Send.

The FedDataCheck (FDC) Tool is a product of Potomac Wave Consulting. The tool automatically scans FPDS for data inconsistencies such as FAR violations, Statutory/Legislative violations, and other data inconsistencies. Contracting Officials are alerted via email when a violation or data inconsistency occurs.

NEW TRAINING AVAILABLE— BUY AMERICAN NON-AVAILABILITY WAIVERS

n January 25, 2021, the President signed Executive Order 14005, "Ensuring the Future is Made in All of America by All of America's Workers." This EO was the catalyst to create a series of actions to enable Federal Agencies to maximize the use of good, products, and material produced in the U.S. On March 7, 2022, the FAR council published FAR Rule 2021-008, which included changes to the requirements of the Buy American statute. In response to these complex changes, FAI released a training video, Amendments to the FAR Buy American Requirements and FAC 097: Navigating Buy American and Trade Agreements.

here are a many accessibility features in Microsoft Office programs that benefit everyone, for example...

Read Aloud

Review > Read Aloud (ALT +CTRL + Space) - Microsoft Word

Message > Read Aloud - Microsoft Outlook

Read Aloud Speech

There are many reasons to listen to a document, such as proofreading, multitasking, or increased comprehension and learning. Listen to email messages or Word documents.

Home > Dictate (ALT +`) - Microsoft Word / Outlook / PowerPoint

Dictate email messages, PowerPoint slides, and Word documents.

Use Dictate to record speech to written word. For example, "I created this sentence using Dictate."

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Styles / Navigation Pane



Home > Styles, View > check Navigation

Once you create document headers (headings) using the <u>Styles</u> menu option in Word or Outlook -

Headings appear in the <u>Navigation Pane</u>, allowing users to quickly find, rearrange, or remove document sections (MS Word).

View > Zoom - Microsoft Office 365

Use Zoom to increase or decrease the size of the information presented on the screen.

<u>Tipl</u> Use when presenting during a Virtual Meeting to help viewers see the information presented.
